BadgerCare Plus Enrollment –Highlights

- **Total Milwaukee County BadgerCare Plus enrollment** reached 287,672 in June 2021, a **24.4% increase** between March 2020 and June 2021– totaling 56,449 added BadgerCare Plus members.
 - Children increased **4.1%**
 - Childless adults increased **47.6%**
 - Parents/caretakers increased **21.1%**
 - Income extensions increased **63.3%**
- *Note: As of March 18, 2020, no existing members of Medicaid or BadgerCare Plus are disenrolled or undergo eligibility redeterminations during the COVID-19 PHE. Reported increases in enrollment include members who have existing enrollment extended who would otherwise have been terminated. Any newly eligible entrants to the program account for an undetermined portion of the reported enrollment increases. However, it is likely that the members sustained in Medicaid coverage under the disenrollment freeze account for the majority of enrollment increases. Some portion of this “freeze” group would have been re-determined Medicaid eligible regardless of the freeze, as they would have lost earnings during the PHE. Others, who have increases in household income or returns to employment, may lose Medicaid enrollment at the end of the PHE, once they go through the eligibility re-determination process.*

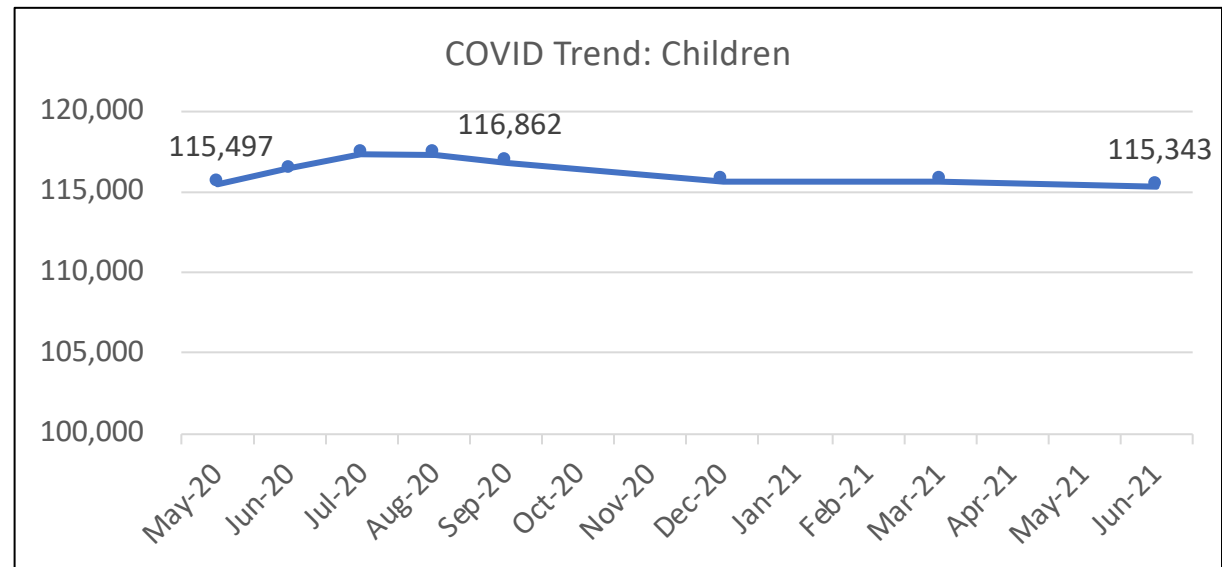
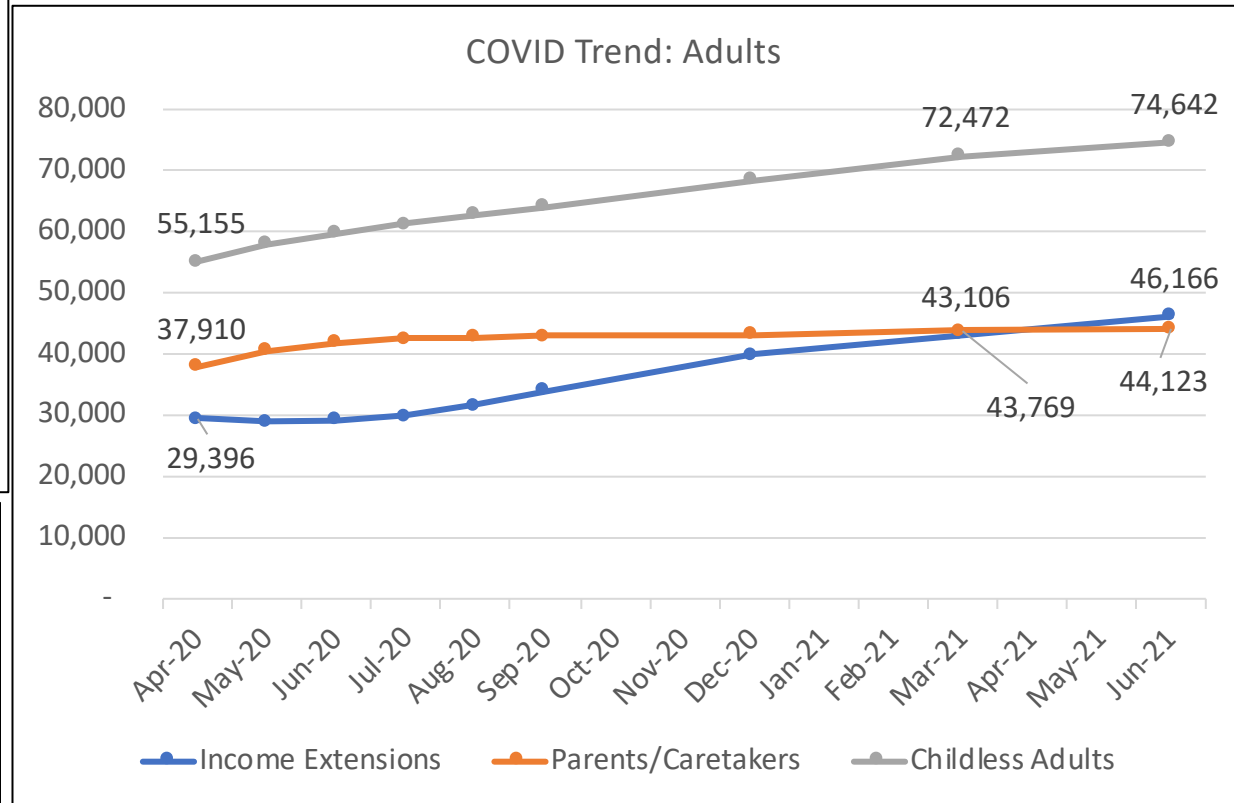
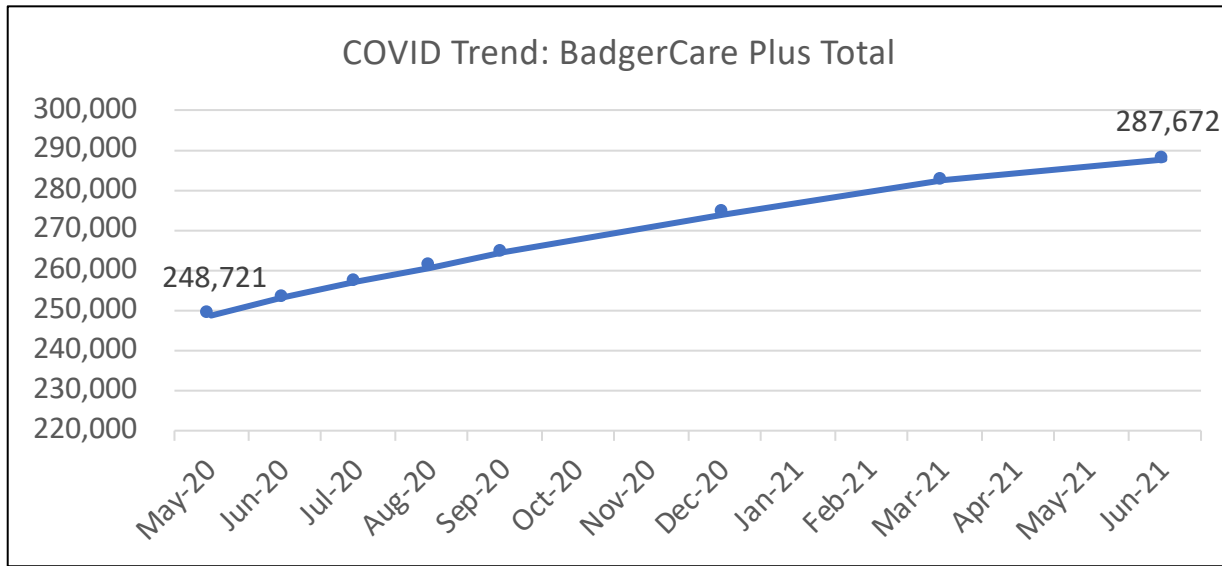

- **Statewide, BadgerCare Plus enrollment increased 31.4%** between March 2020 and June 2021, with 1,021,031 members counted for June 2021 enrollment (an increase of 242,719 since March 2020).

*A BadgerCare Plus extension is a period of eligibility given to a person when the assistance group's income increases above 100 percent FPL either due to an increase in earned income and/or spousal support and otherwise meets the BadgerCare Plus eligibility criteria for people with incomes below 100 percent FPL.

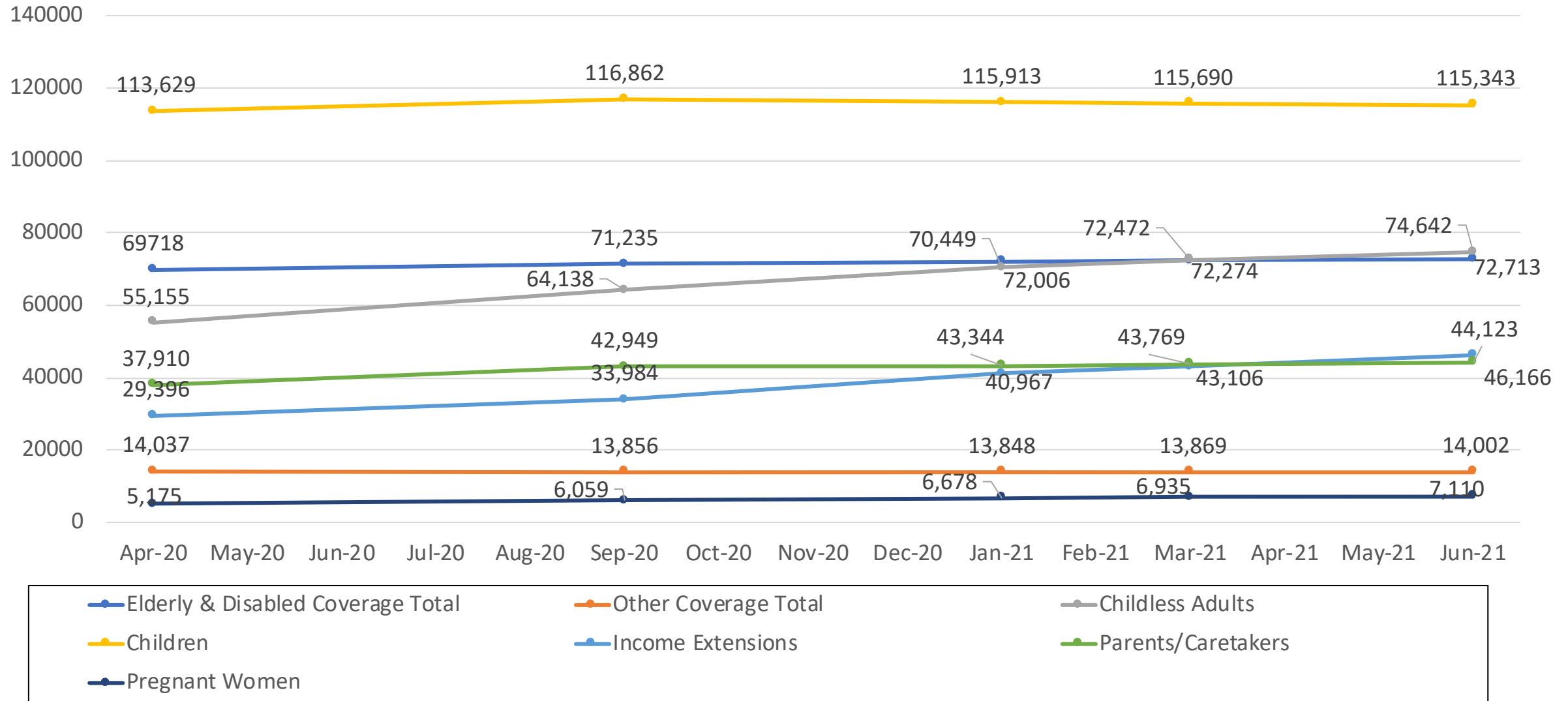

Change with COVID-19 Public Health Emergency



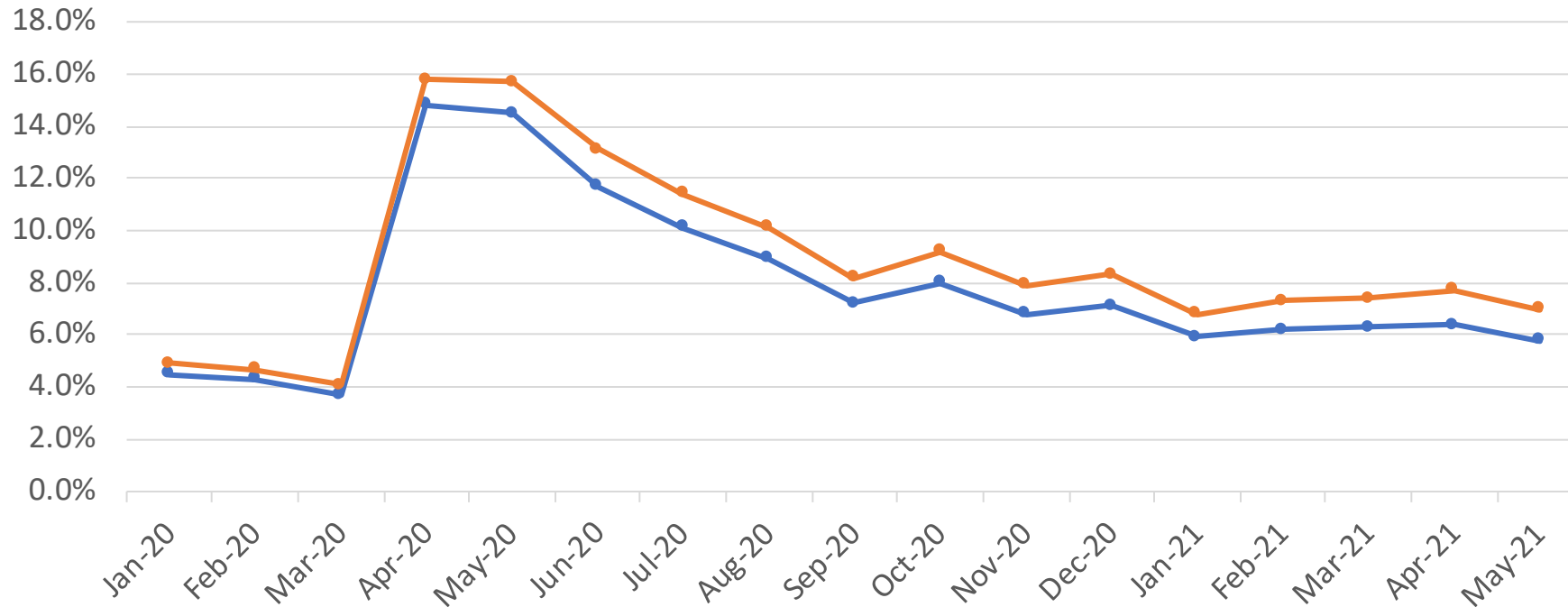

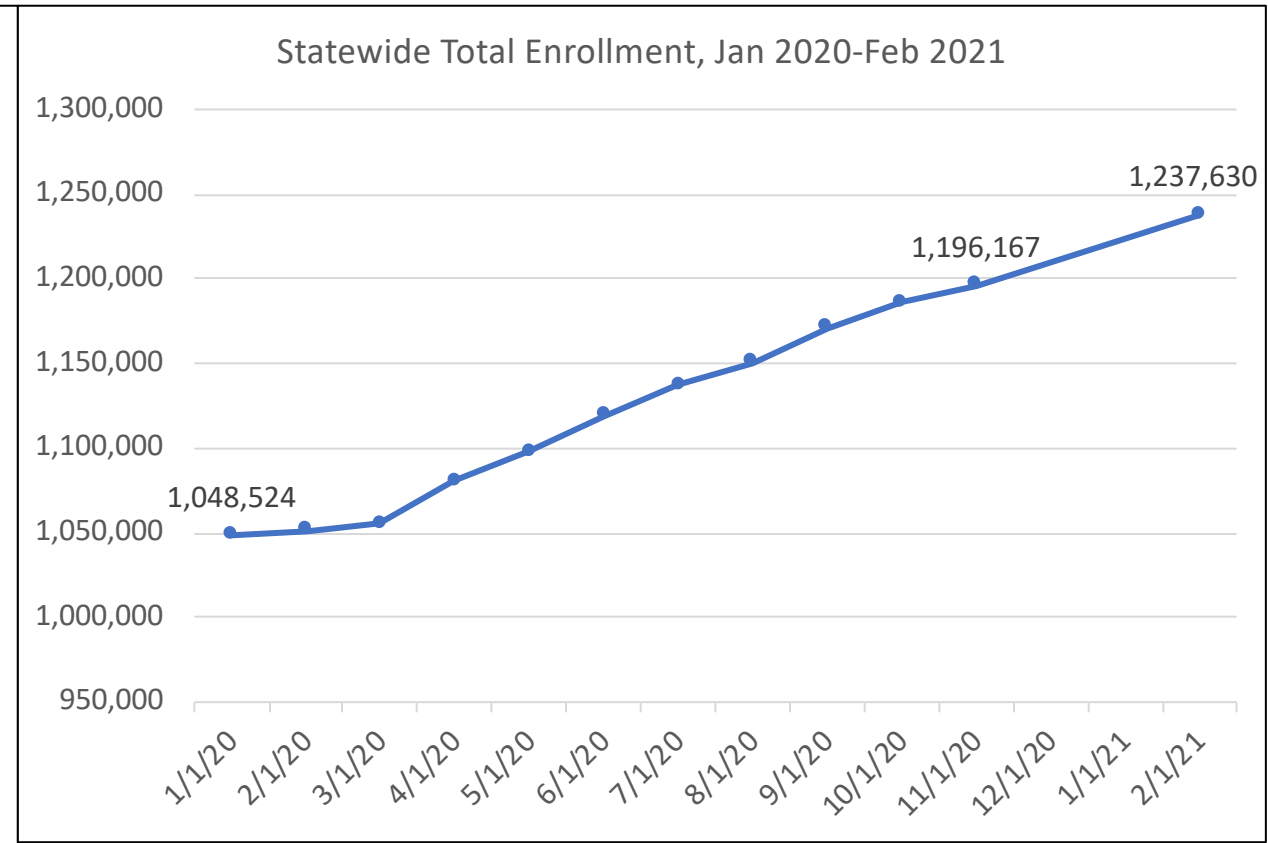
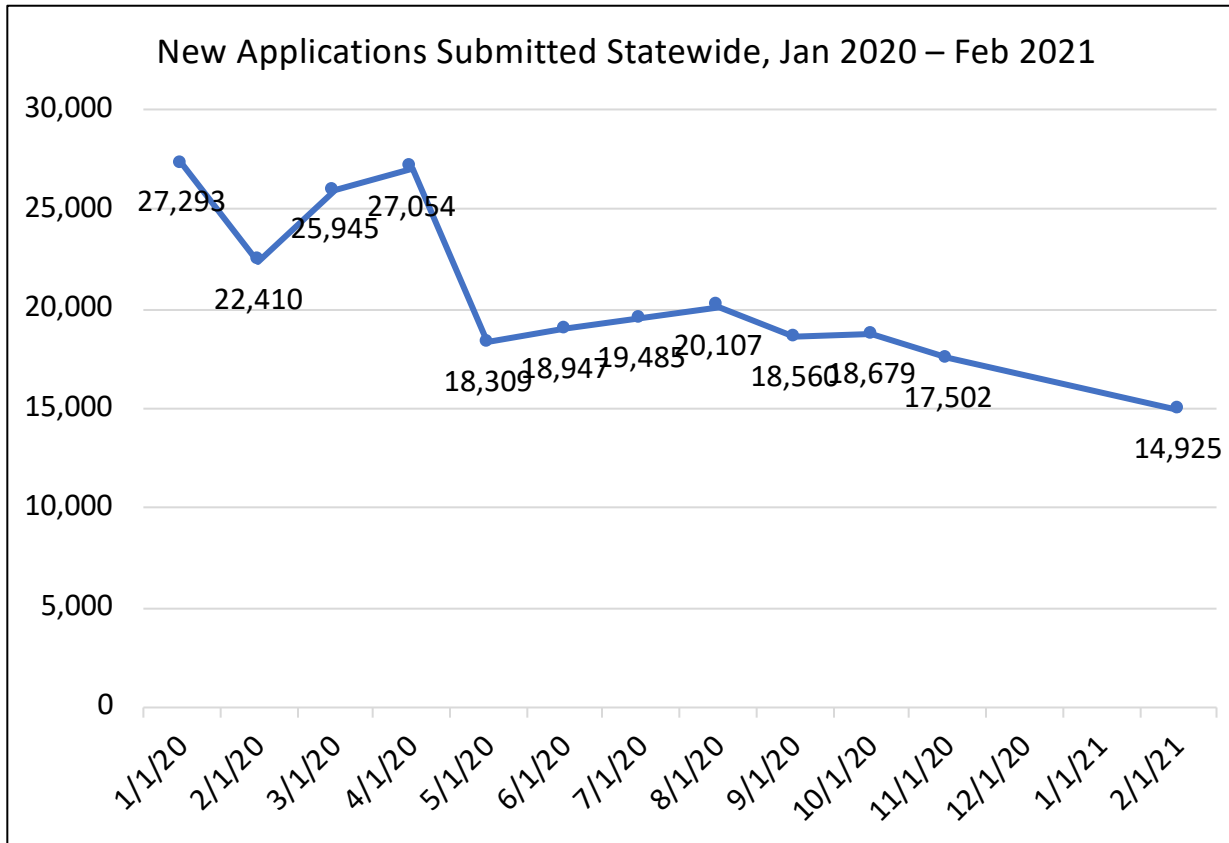
County City

- The unemployment rate tripled at the start of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Employment has steadily, but not fully recovered.
- Unemployment as of May 2021 remains 49% higher than pre-pandemic in the City of Milwaukee, and 35% higher than pre-pandemic in Milwaukee County.

BadgerCare Enrollment

Change with COVID-19 Public Health Emergency – Planning for Unwinding

- Accumulation of existing cases due to March 2020 disenrollment freeze – rather than ongoing new applicants -- accounts for most of the enrollment growth that has occurred since that time.
- Most increase in caseload since early 2020 will need to be re-assessed for eligibility at the end of the public health emergency (planned for end of CY2021); Many will lose eligibility and need to find other sources of coverage.



Medicaid Enrollment

Milwaukee County compared to Wisconsin Statewide

- As of June 2021,
 - 40% of Milwaukee County residents (374,387 people) are enrolled in Medicaid
 - 26% of Wisconsin residents (1,470,378 people) are enrolled in Medicaid
 - Milwaukee County accounts for a quarter of Wisconsin's statewide Medicaid enrollments.

- American Community Survey 2019 data (most recent available):
 - 21% of Milwaukee County residents (192,495 people) had Medicaid alone as their health insurance
 - 12% of Wisconsin residents had Medicaid alone as their health insurance

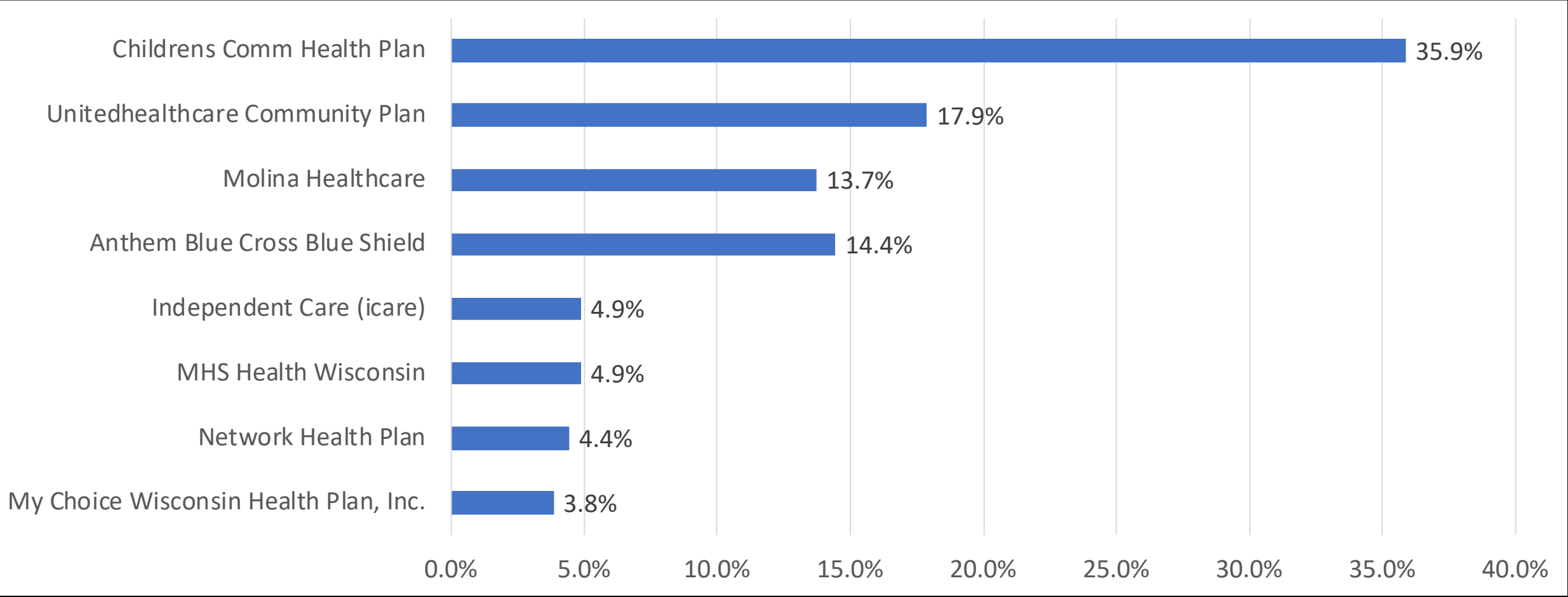

Medicaid HMO BadgerCare Enrollment

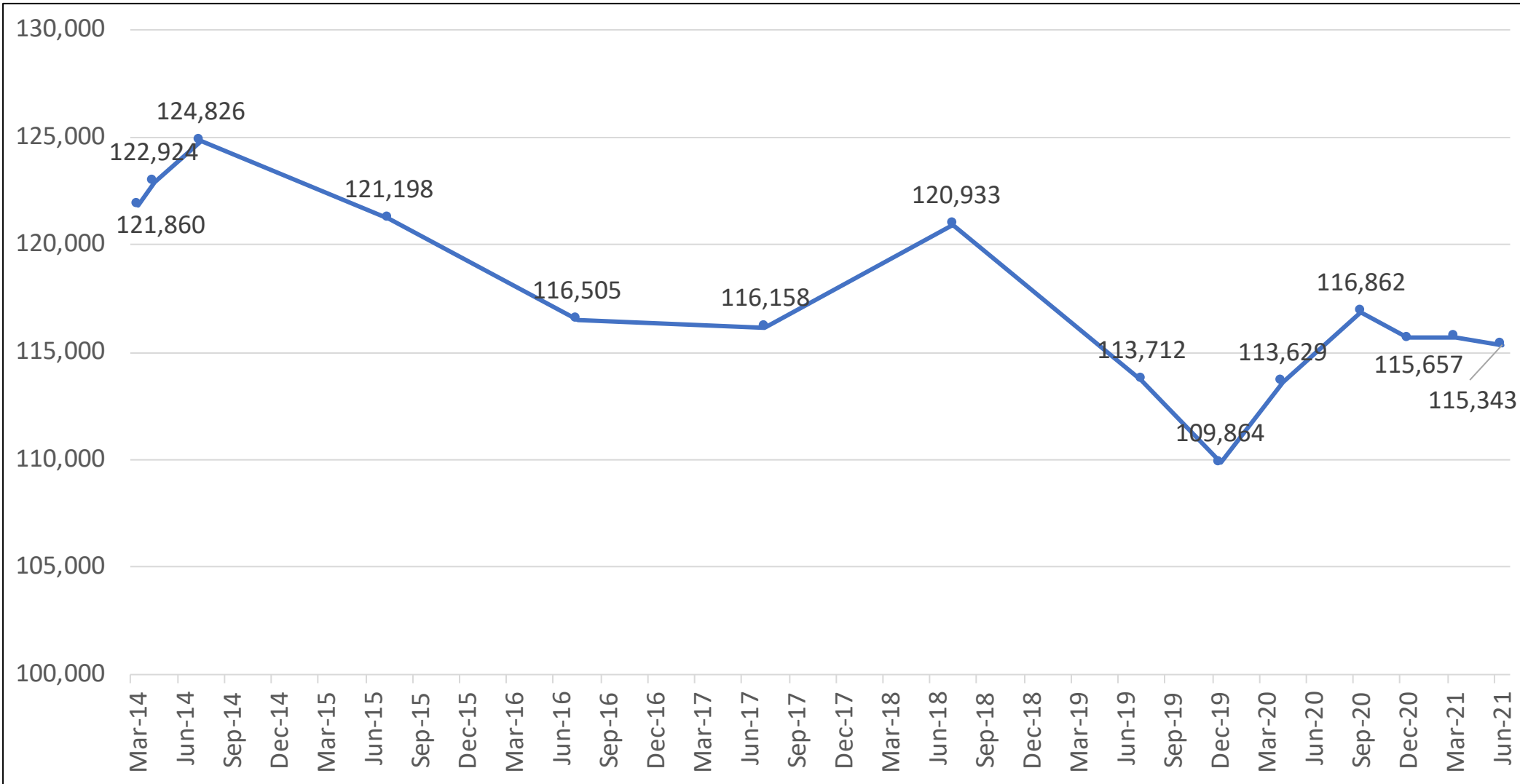
Milwaukee County, June 2021

Milwaukee County, March 2014 to June 2021

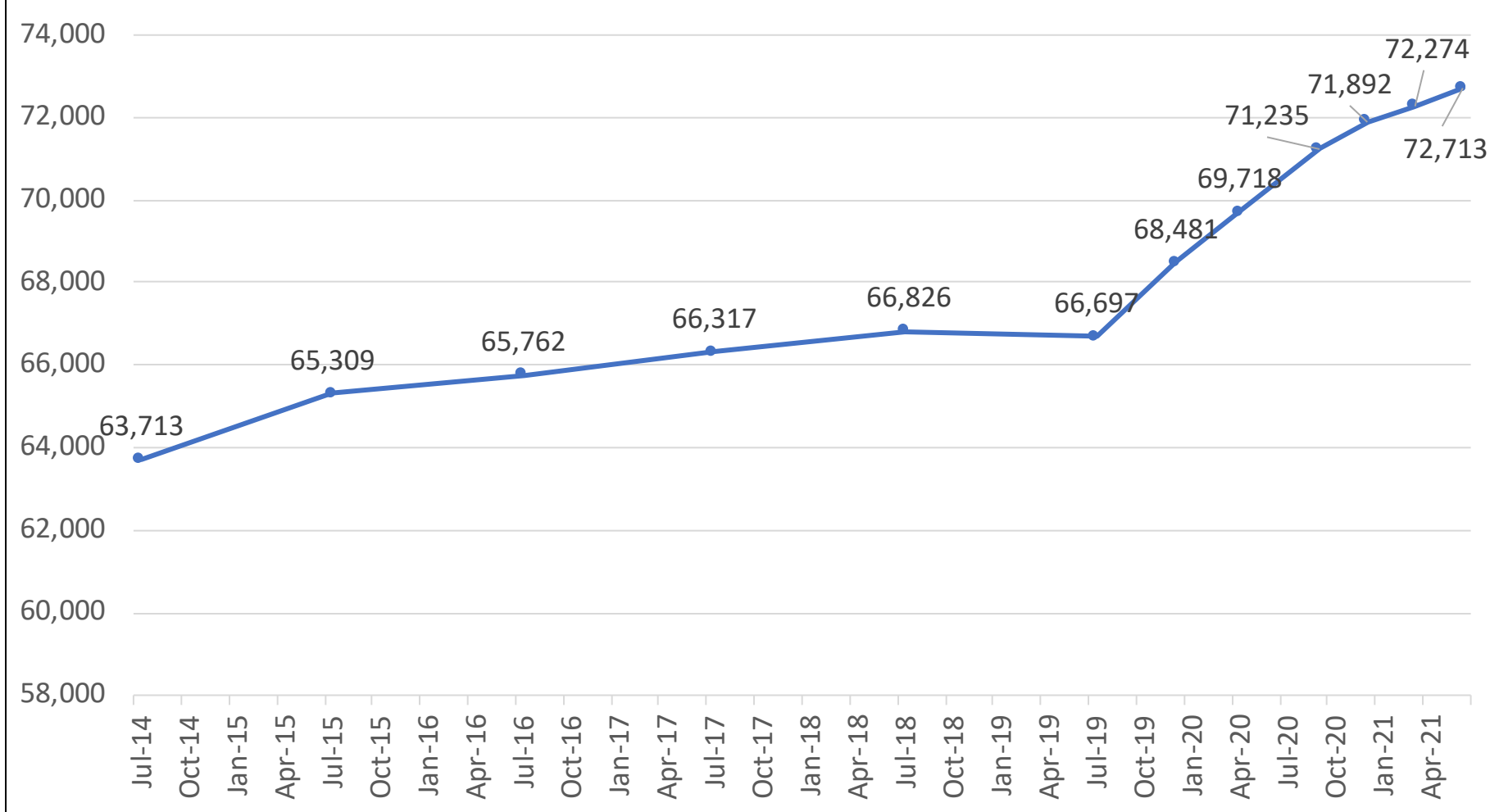


Children's enrollment in BadgerCare declined since the month prior to the initiation of Medicaid reforms in 2014, but started to increase in 2020 and then level off in 2021.

- EBD includes SSI, SSI-related, Institutionalized, Waiver, MAPP, Katie Beckett Program.
- EBD has been steadily increasing at a lower rate since 2013, and is increasing more substantially since mid-2019.

ACA Marketplace Enrollment – OE8 Highlights

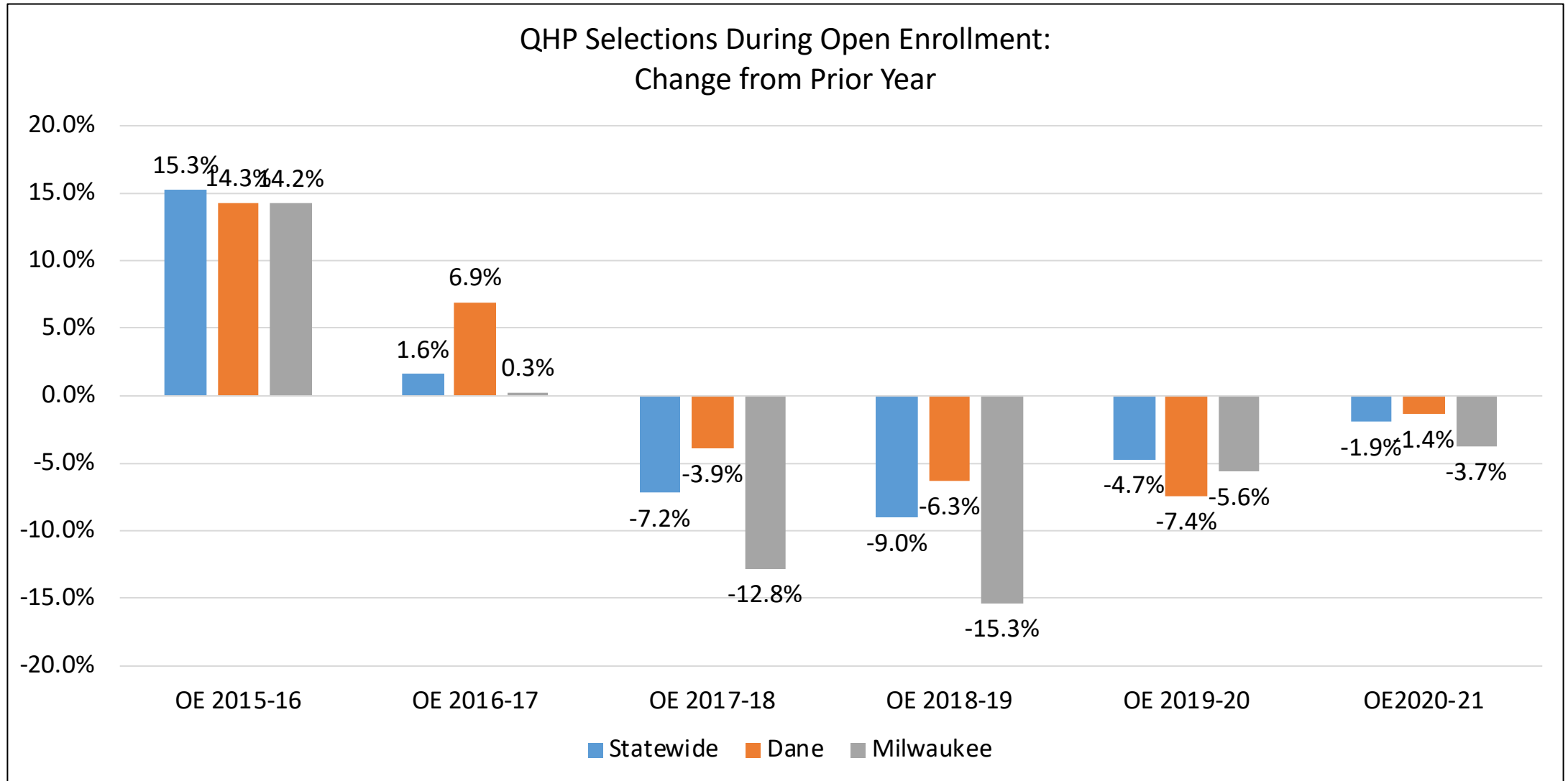
- A detailed Marketplace report from Open Enrollment (OE) 8 (Nov. 1 – Dec 15, 2020), including county level data, was just released by CMS (slides 4-8).
- **Nationally**, enrollment through HealthCare.gov **increased by about 6.6%** compared to last year during OE8.
- The ACA OE8 in **Wisconsin** saw a **2% decline** from the previous year's open enrollment period.
- It is not yet clear what might have contributed to the decline in Wisconsin's Marketplace enrollments. It may relate to the substantial increase in Medicaid enrollment, and the suspension of Medicaid disenrollments and redeterminations, under the public health emergency continuous coverage policy.
- Due to the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency (PHE), Marketplace enrollment re-opened from February 15 – August 15, 2021.

Marketplace Enrollment Data for OE8

- Nationally, plan selections through HealthCare.gov **increased by about 6.6% during Open Enrollment 8**, compared to Open Enrollment 7.
- The ACA OE8 yielded **191,702** Marketplace Plan selections in WI. This amounted to a **2% decline** from the previous year's open enrollment period.

- ACA Plan Selections during open enrollment have decreased statewide and in the state's two largest counties.
- The decline in Dane County has generally been smaller than the statewide rate of decline.
- The decline in Milwaukee County has exceeded the rate of statewide decline.



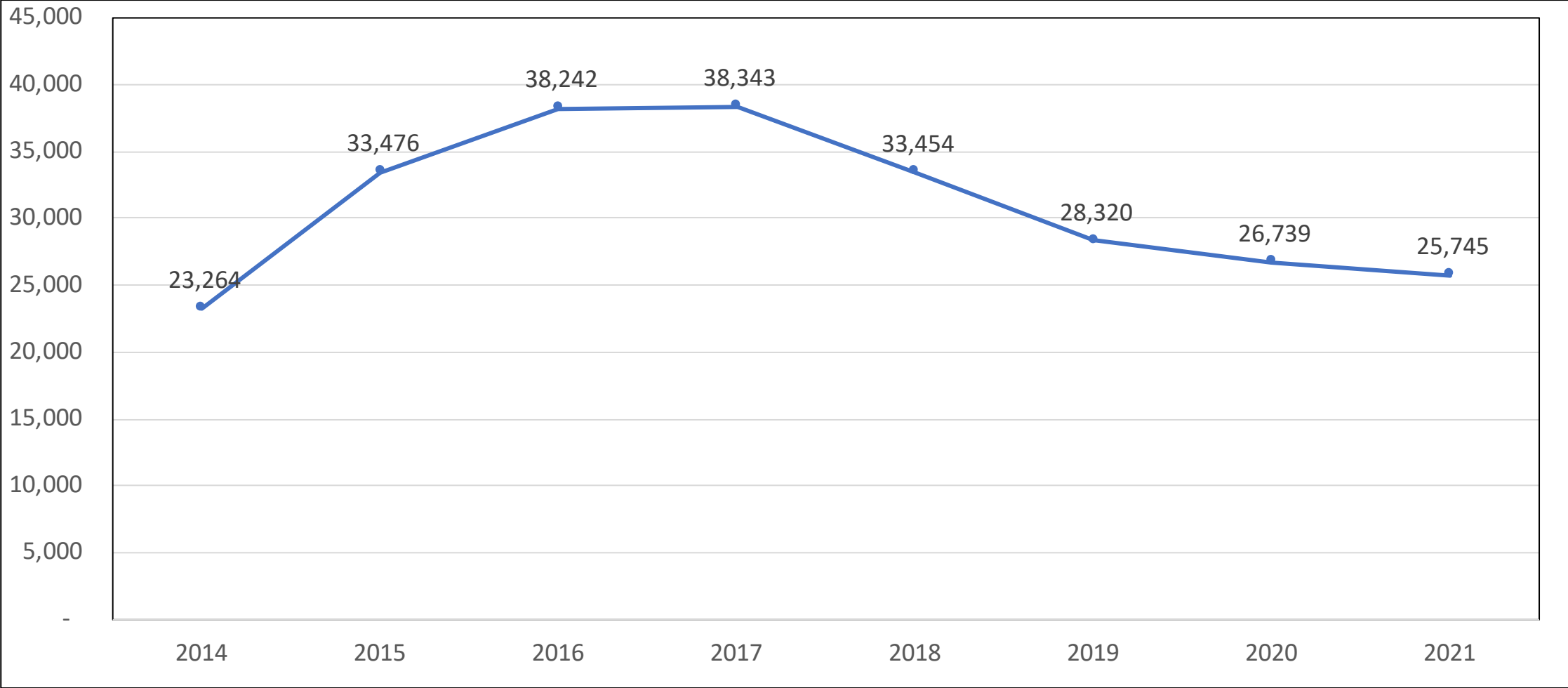

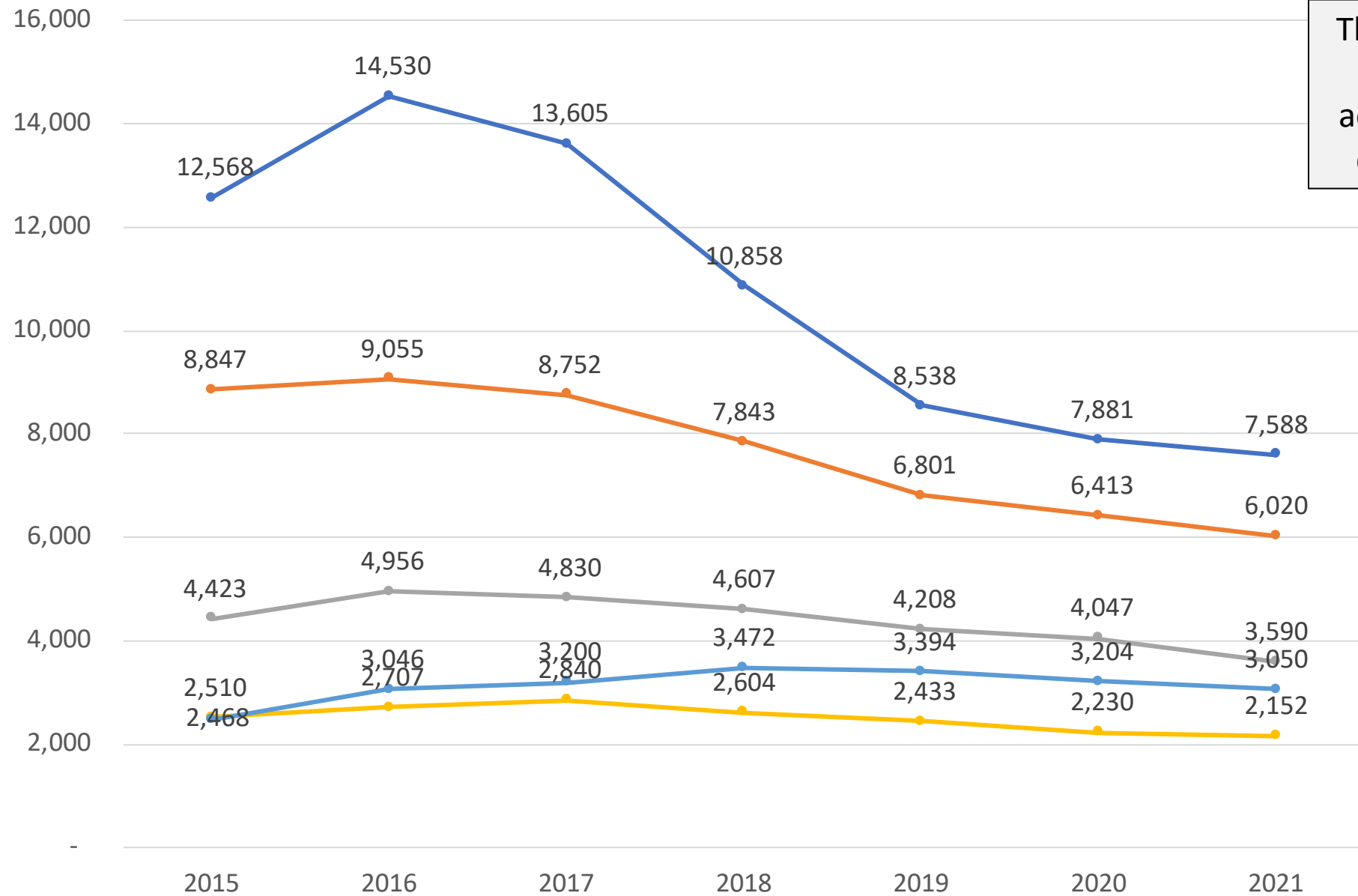

Plan Selections for Milwaukee County , Trend 2014-2021



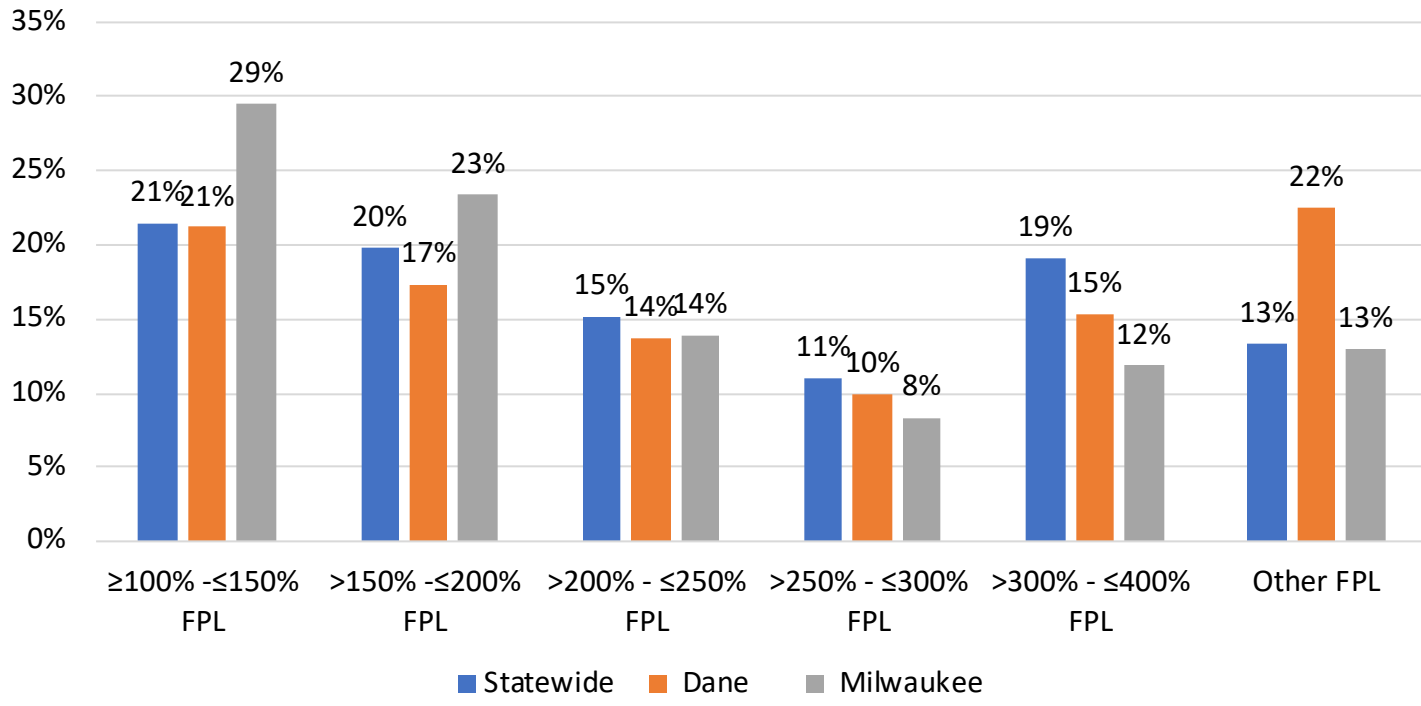
Plan Selections by Income Range, Milwaukee County, 2015-2021

- >300% - ≤400% FPL

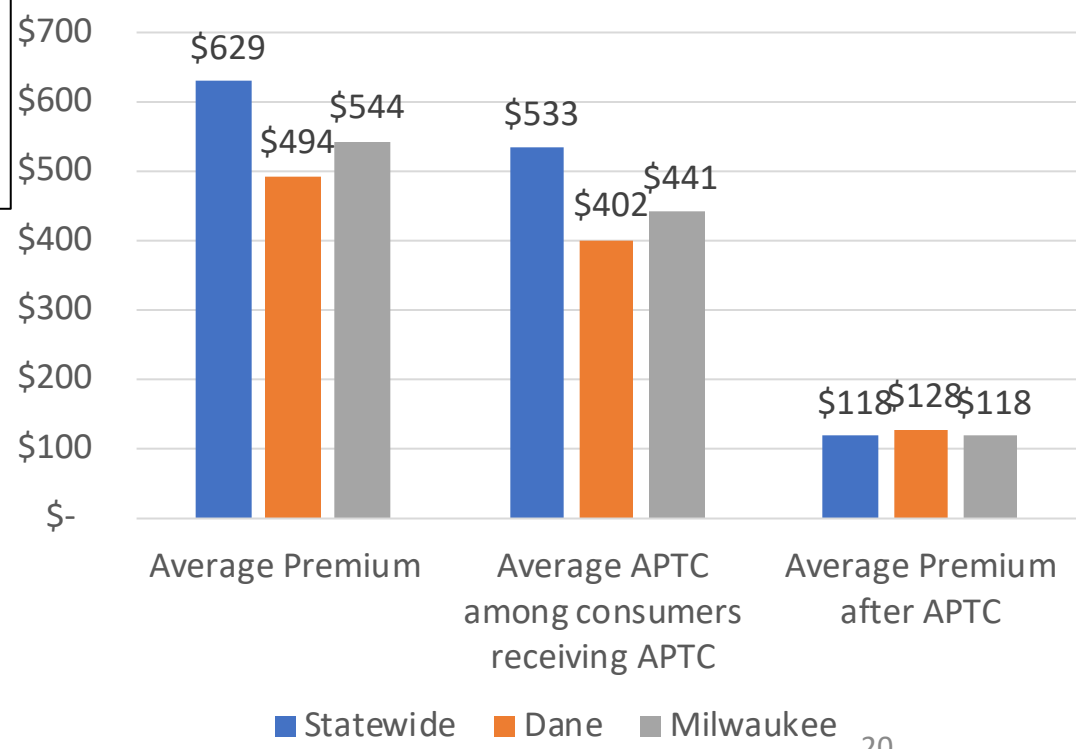
Income Range of Consumers Selecting Health Plans, Plan Year 2021



Milwaukee County:
 More lower income consumers, with more qualifying for APTCs. With more qualifying for CSRs, higher selection of silver plans. Average premium after APTC relatively low.

Dane County:
 More non-eligible for APTCs. Higher incomes among those with APTCs, so fewer qualifying for CSRs. More selecting non-silver plan. Average premium after APTC relatively higher.

QHP Premiums, Plan Year 2021

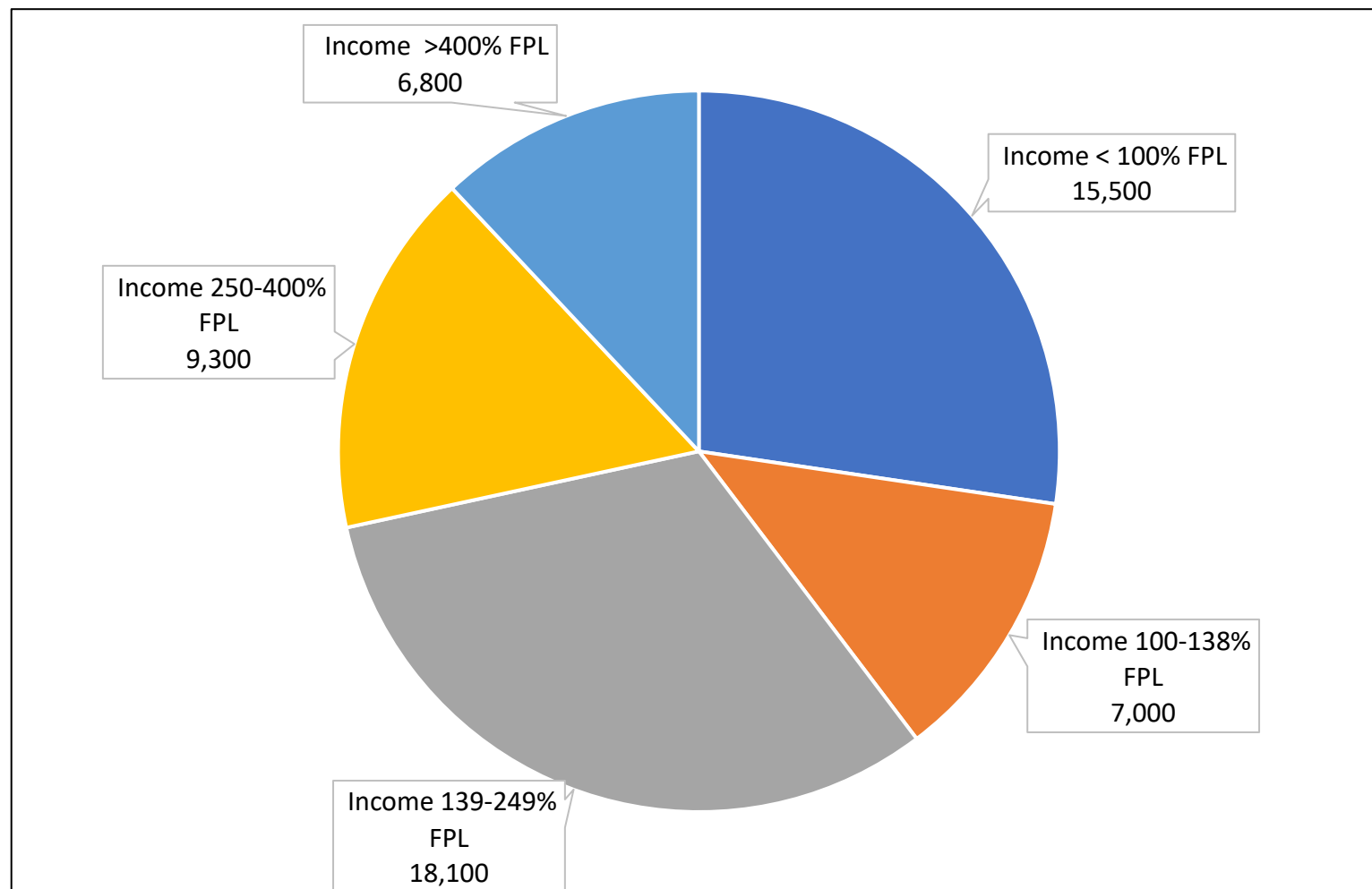

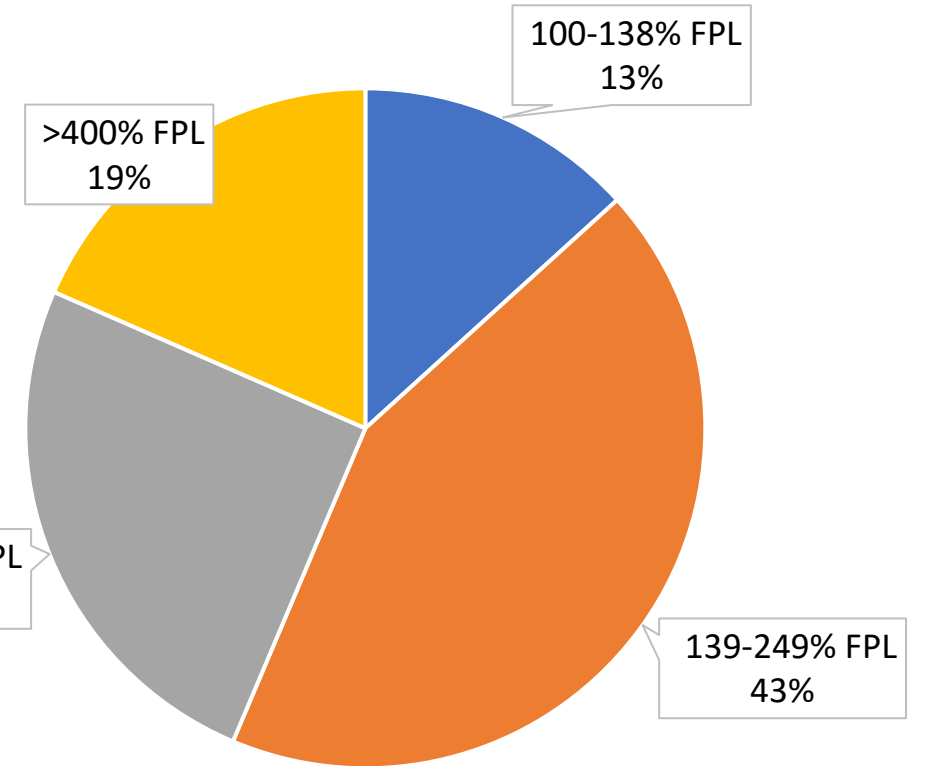

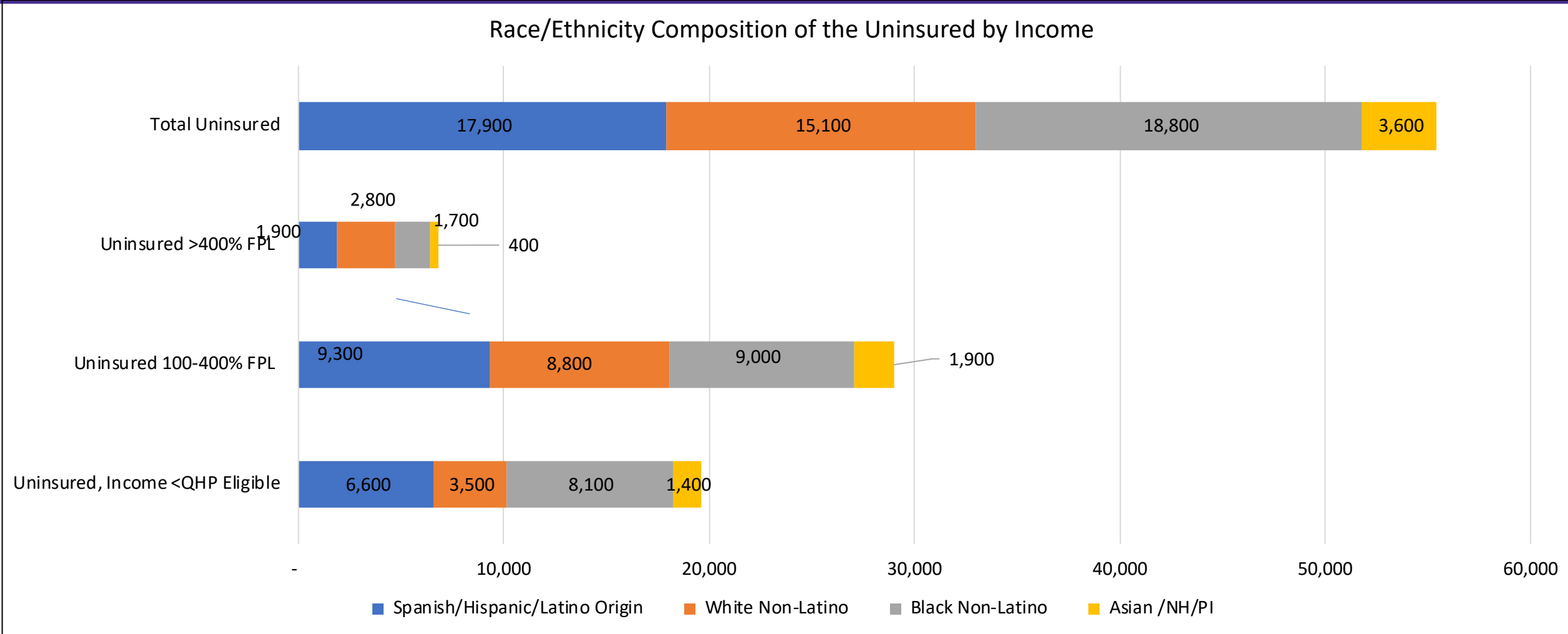
Uninsured, QHP Eligible

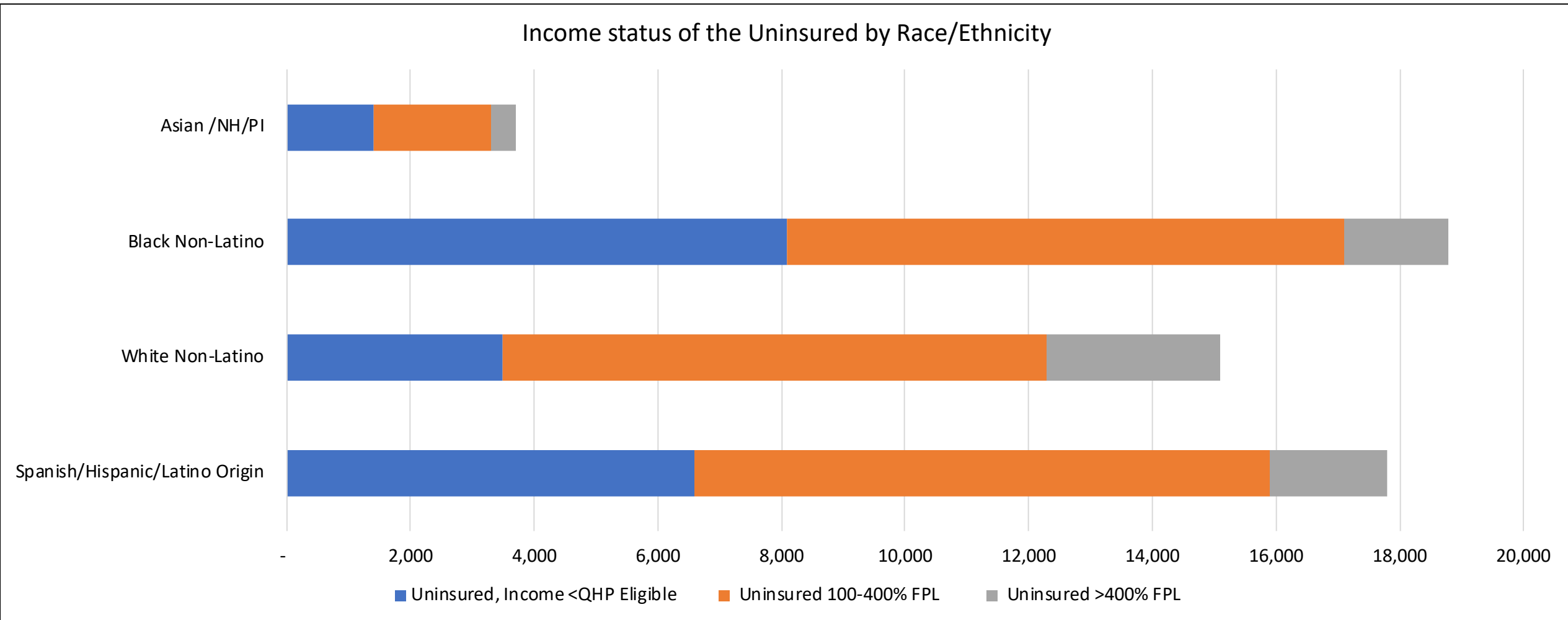

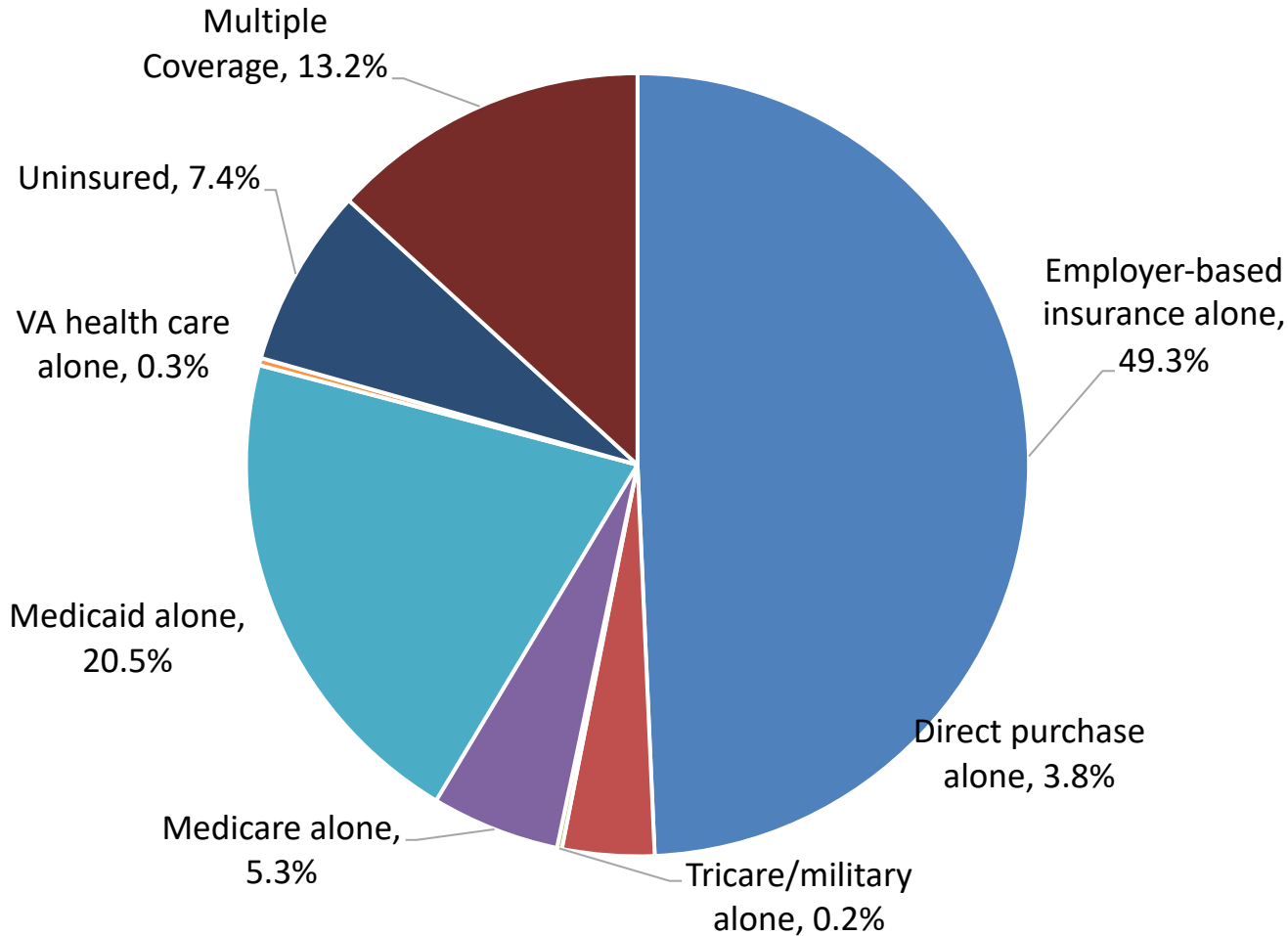

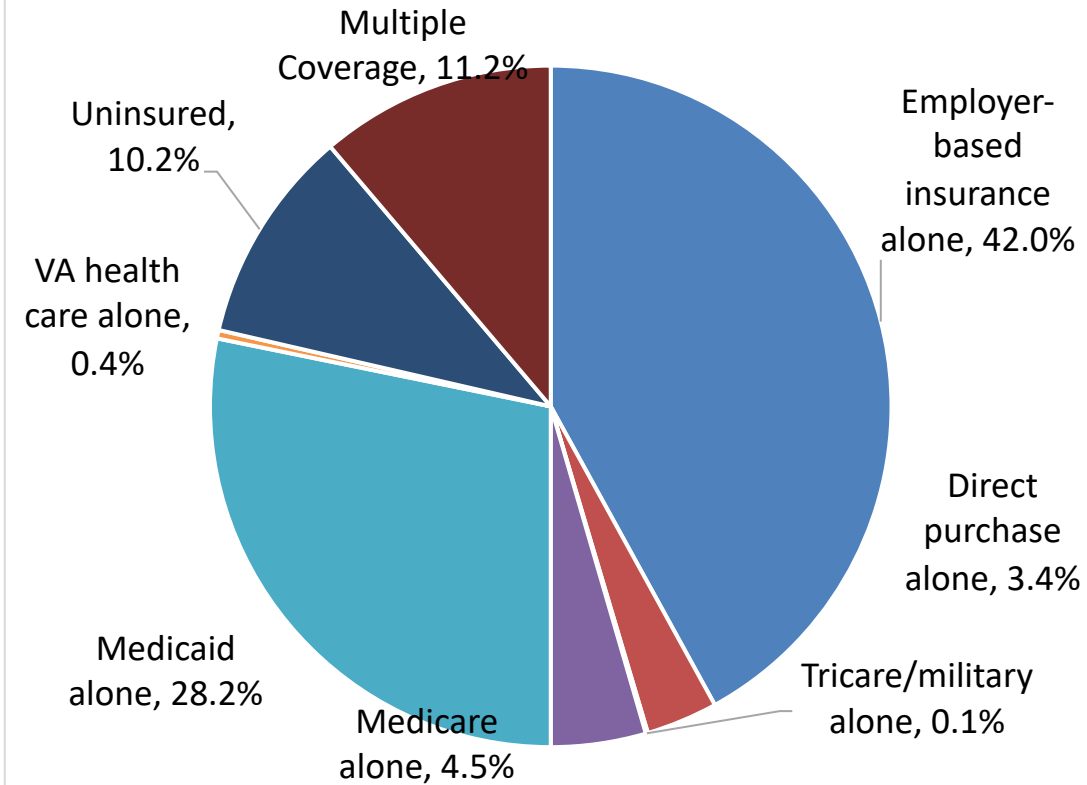

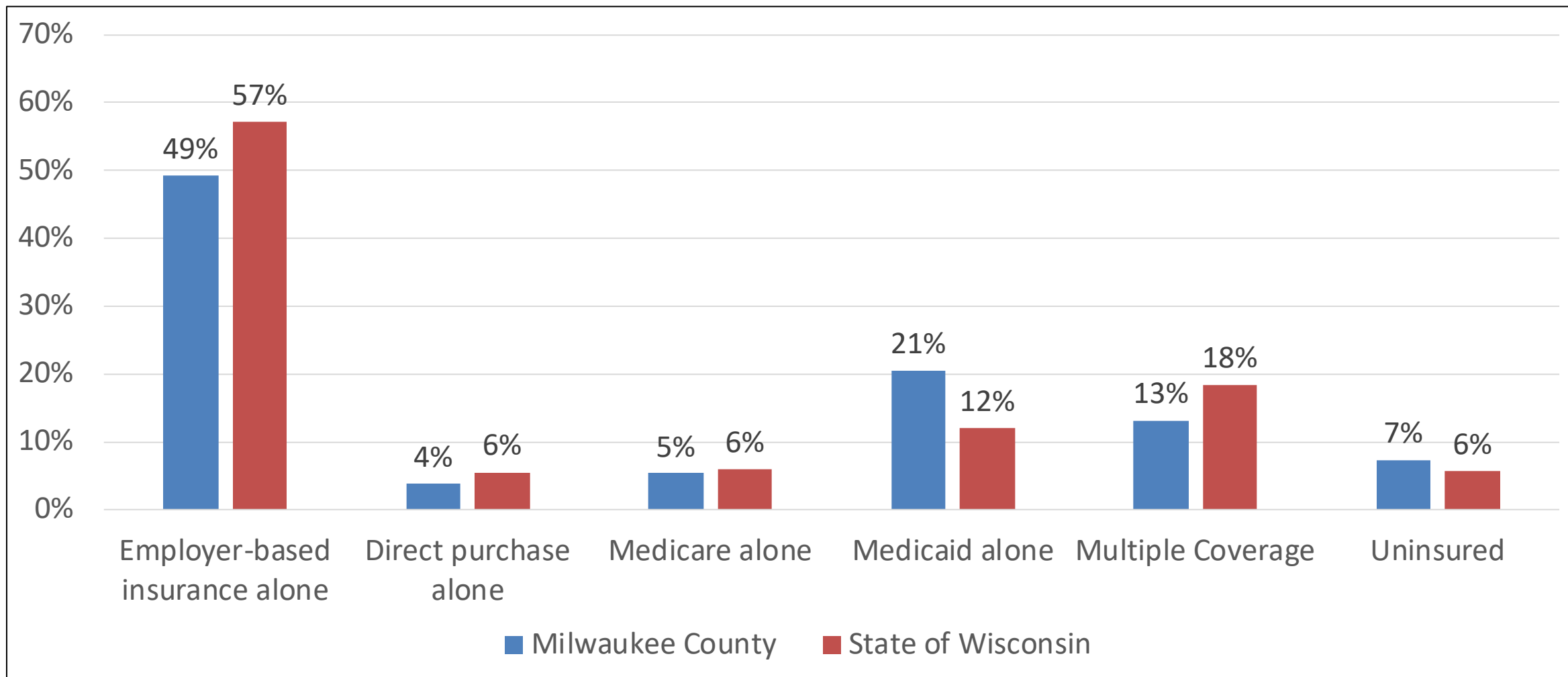

Milwaukee County Compared to Statewide 2019



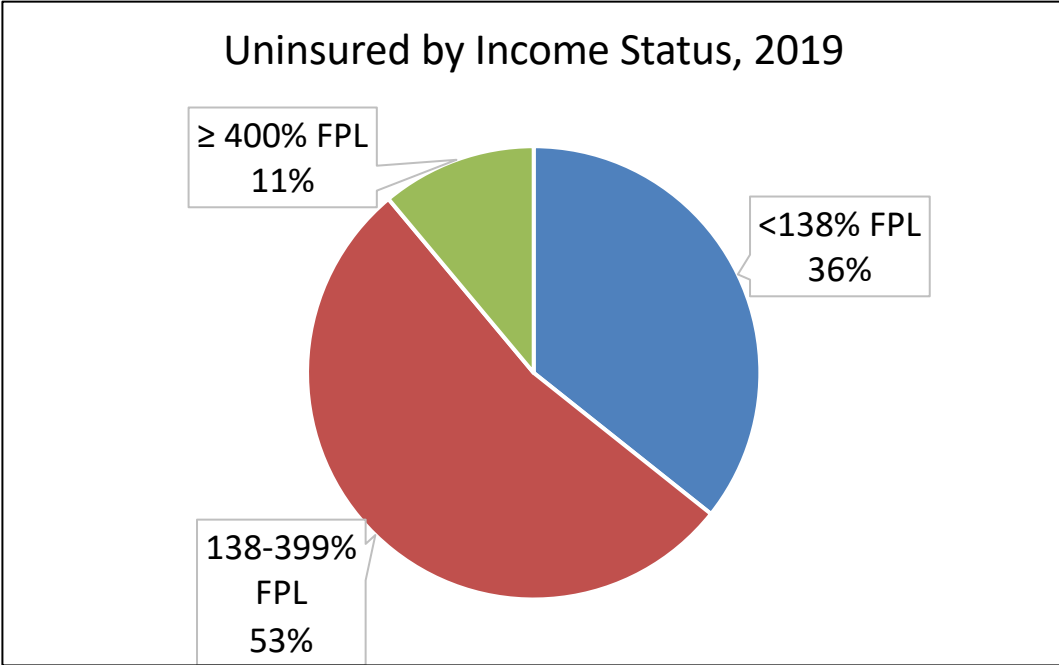

Milwaukee County residents below 100% FPL account for 21% of the uninsured, with 14,462 uninsured in this income group. Most should qualify for Medicaid/BadgerCare Plus.

Milwaukee County residents with incomes above 400% FPL experienced a 13% increase in uninsured between 2017 to 2019, while the percentage of uninsured with incomes <100% FPL declined by 15%.



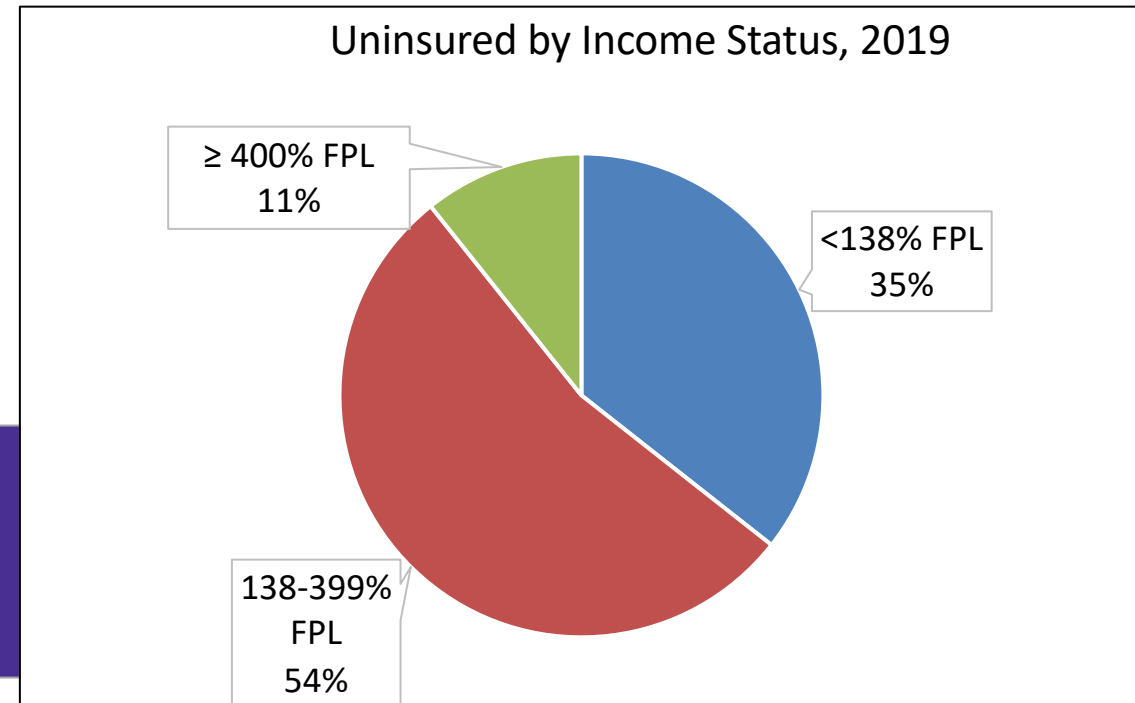

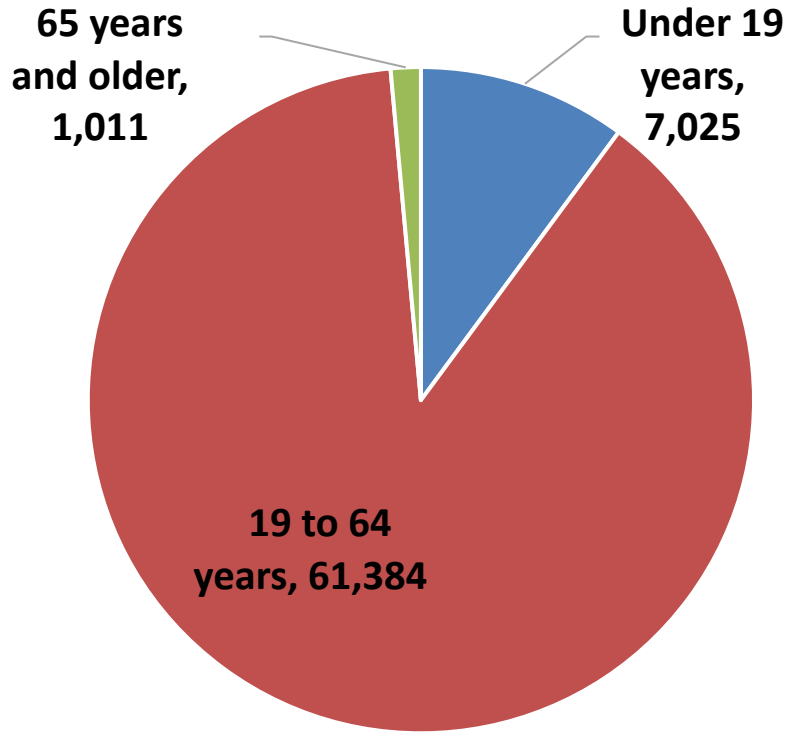
City of Milwaukee residents below 100% FPL account for 21% of the total uninsured, with 12,414 uninsured in this income group. Most should qualify for Medicaid/BadgerCare Plus.

City of Milwaukee residents with incomes above 400% FPL experienced a 73% increase in uninsured between 2017 to 2019, while the percentage of uninsured with incomes <100% FPL declined by 15%.



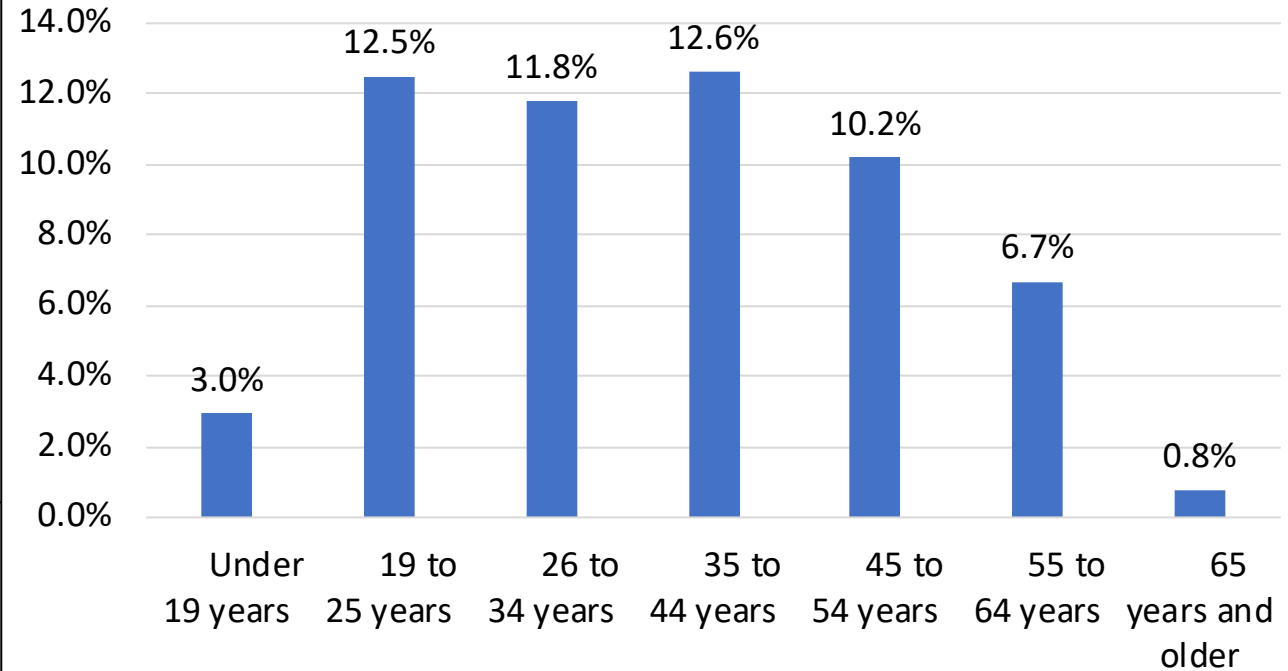

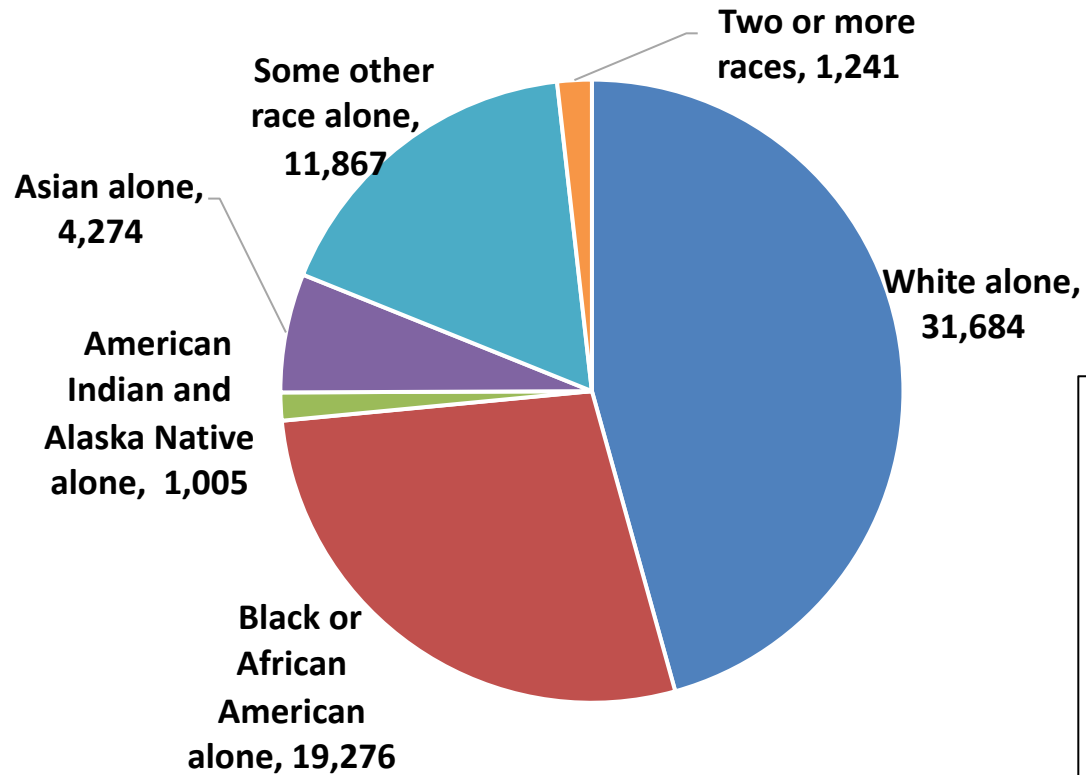
Uninsured at Age Range: Milwaukee County

Uninsured by Race, ACS 2019

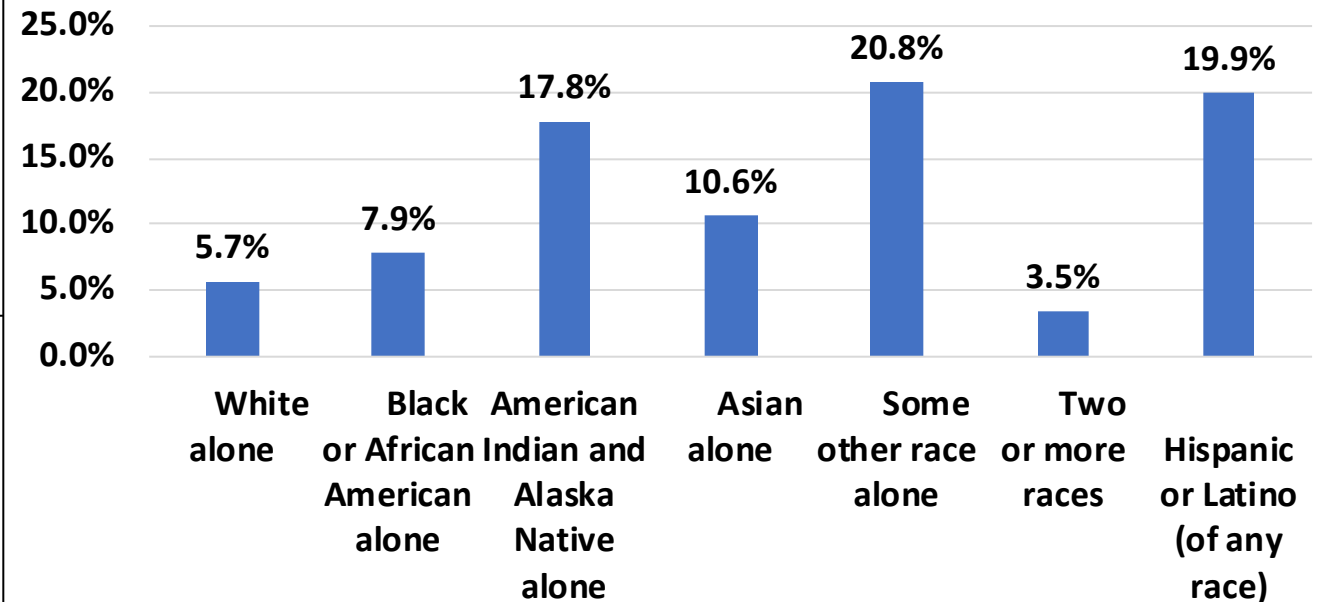

Percentage of Uninsured who are employed

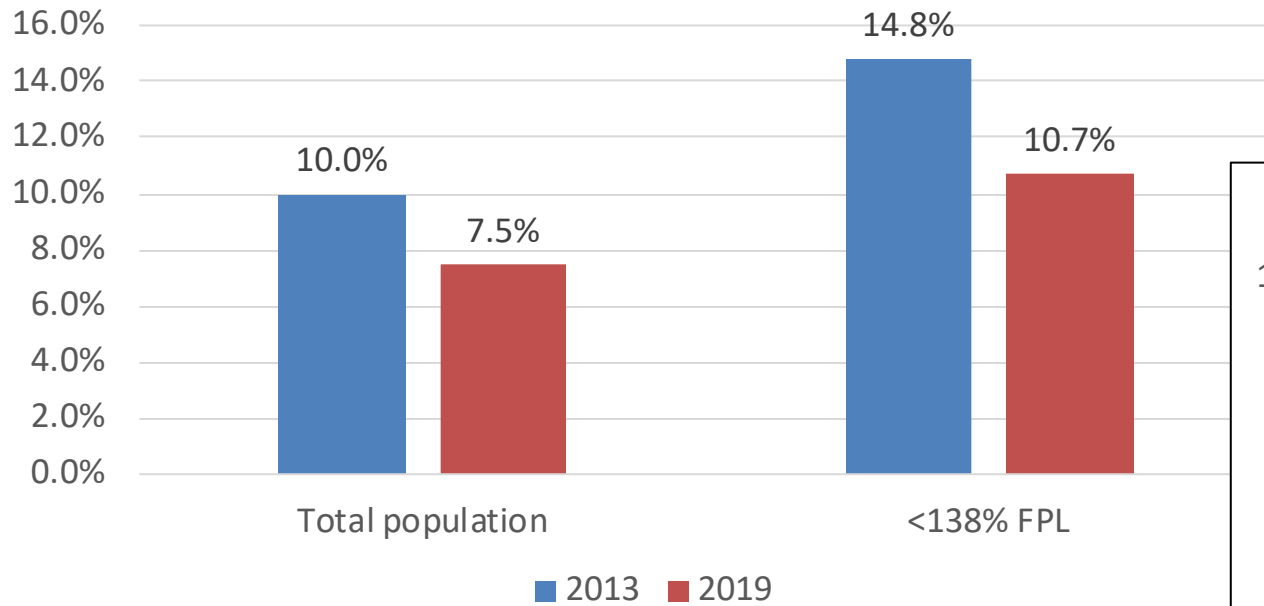

Percent of Uninsured within each Race/Ethnicity



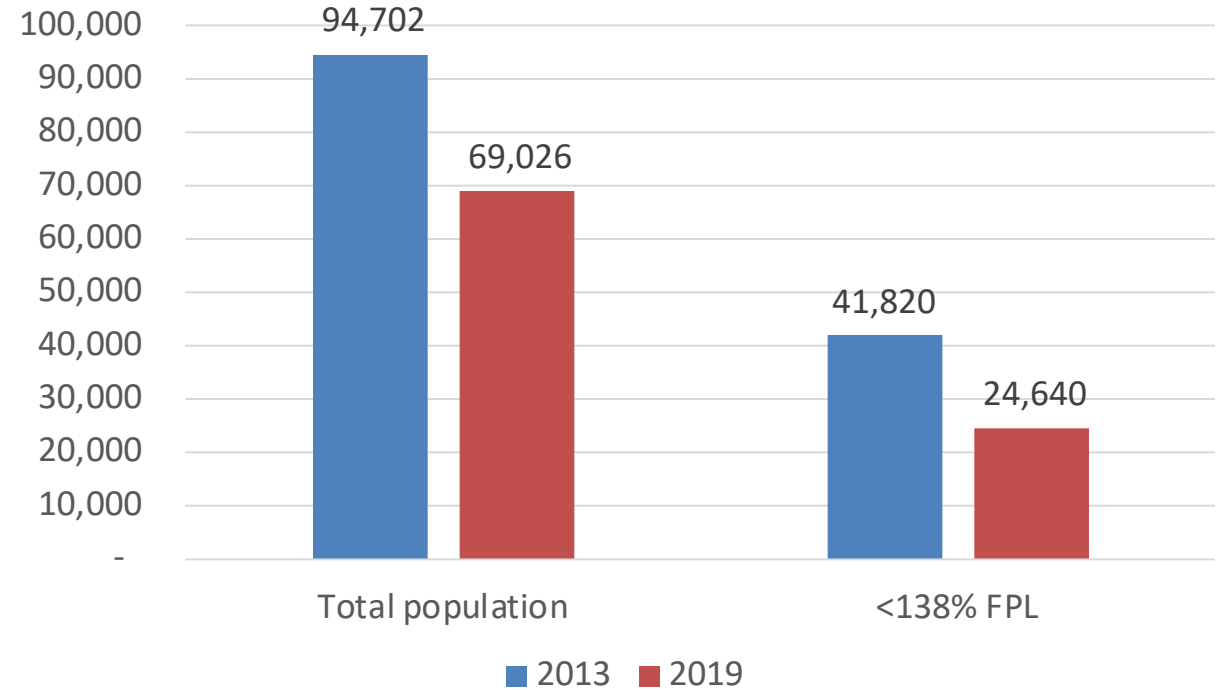

The uninsured rate has decreased by 27%, and across all income groups since 2013, and by 41% for persons below 138% FPL.

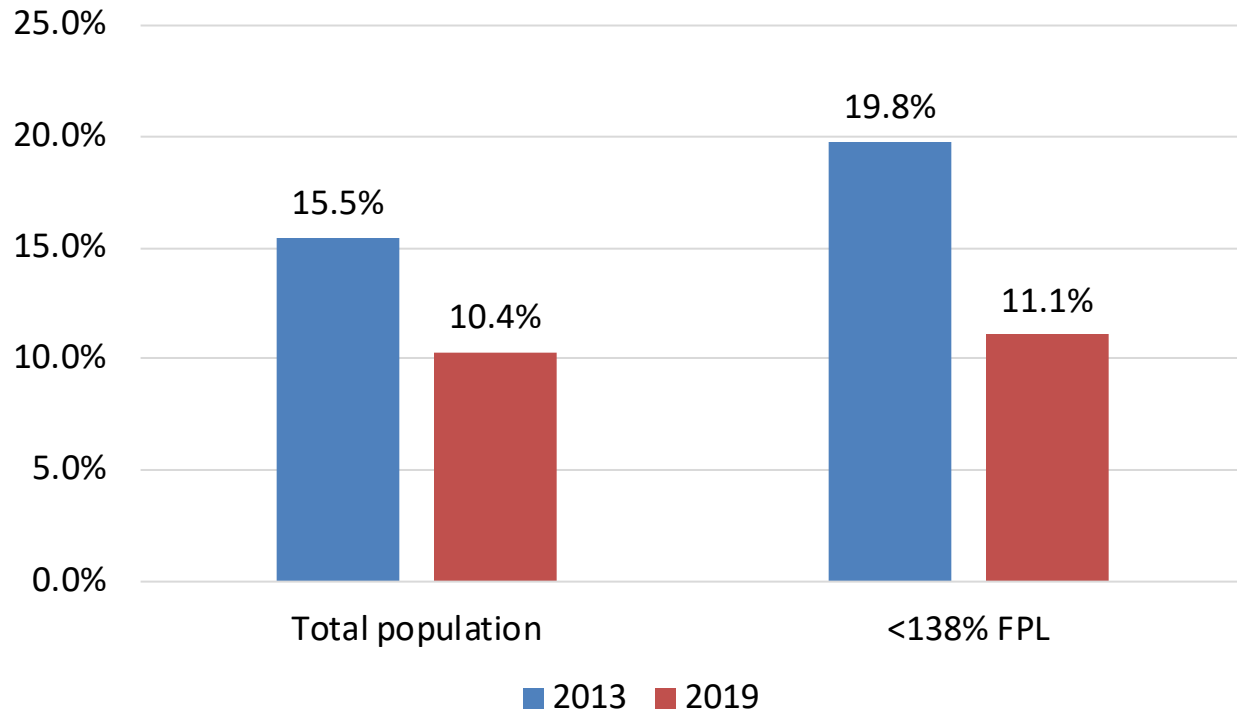
Milwaukee County, Change in Uninsured, 2013-2019

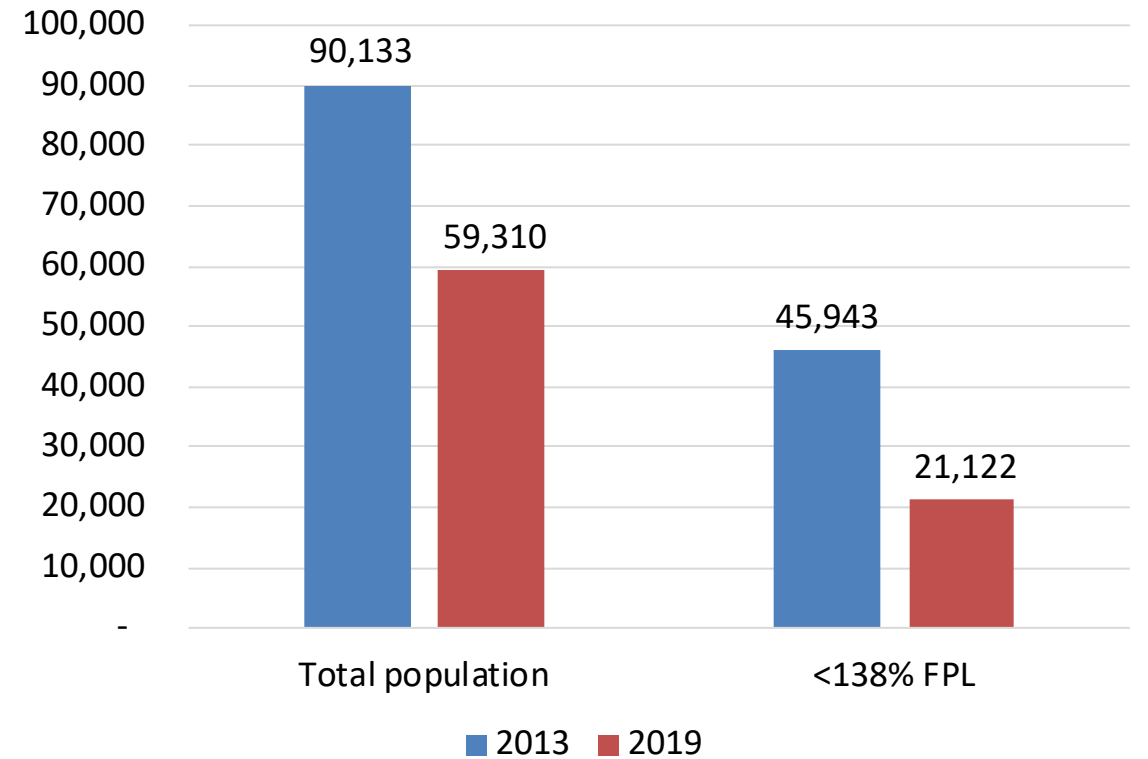
Uninsured in City of Milwaukee , 2013-2019
