OVERVIEW

Milwaukee Health Services, Inc. (MHSI), received a competitive Teaching Health Center (THC) graduate medical education award through the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) to support a new family medicine residency – the North Side Milwaukee Health Centers Family Medicine Residency- at their Isaac Coggs Heritage Health Center.







ISSUE

- Minority populations are disproportionately affected by health problems
- National studies demonstrate the need to diversify health professionals to improve outcomes
- Significant gaps exist in the primary care workforce for disenfranchised population groups

GOALS

- Increase access to care and improve outcomes for historically marginalized populations in Milwaukee
- Build a pipeline for physician employment at Milwaukee health centers
- Increase percentage of physicians who choose to practice in community-based settings
- Diversify the physician workforce in Milwaukee
